

Driving in winter weather requires extra precautions. Prepare your vehicle by checking the battery, tire pressure, fluid levels, and lights, and lubricate door and trunk locks to prevent freezing. Keep an emergency kit with essentials like warm clothes, food, water, a phone charger, and an ice scraper. Always monitor weather conditions and avoid traveling during sleet, snow, or freezing rain. If you must drive, slow down, maintain extra distance from other vehicles, and avoid cruise control. Ensure your gas tank is full, and approach bridges and overpasses cautiously, as ice accumulates there first. Stay alert for downed trees or power lines, and treat intersections with non-functioning traffic lights as four-way stops.
