



### AN ASPHALT TRADITION **UNLIKE ANY OTHER**

exas has seen tremendous population growth over the last several decades, and with that comes higher traffic volumes. The need for superior pavements in Texas has never been greater. Advancements in asphalt materials design like Superpave, Stone Matrix Asphalt, Thin Overlay Mixtures, and others have allowed asphalt technology to keep up with the increasing performance safe and smooth roads demand.

We are fortunate enough in Texas to have top-tier, nationally renowned universities that conduct some of the most advanced asphalt materials research in the world. It is regularly featured at national conferences and published in top scientific journals. Similarly, TxDOT has one of the most impressive DOT materials testing labs for collaboration and internal research.

Recently there has been a number of requests within TXAPA's membership to have Texas universities, agencies, and consultants share their research findings with TXAPA and their membership. Some of the research could impact future specifications or be geared towards material producers and contractors for future implementation.

TxDOT already does a fantastic job of communicating research updates at a high level to TXAPA members during the annual and membership meetings, but the time available during the meetings to present those updates is limited. If a separate forum was available, there would be more time to present research at a deeper level with greater detail and to get industry feedback.

At first, the Major Associate member committee raised the need for such a forum on asphalt binder materials, followed by a similar request from the Level II Mix Design committee, but on mixtures and aggregates. Since all three topics are interrelated and of interest to TXAPA members, the idea of having a forum on all pavement-related research topics was introduced.

From there, the MASTERS was born. I'm not talking about golf, green jackets, or dramatic Sundays (cue the music), but an annual forum titled Materials and Asphalt Technology Research Summit (MASTERS), or simply Research Summit if you don't want to get too fancy with the name.

The first research event TXAPA hosted was in December 2023. At least 40 people attended the event, which was held during an afternoon at TXAPA's headquarters in Buda. It was mostly focused on asphalt binder materials with presentations by the Center for Transportation Research (CTR) at UT Austin and by the Texas A&M Transportation Institute (TTI). With the success of that event, TXAPA held the next forum and first official MASTERS event on July 24-25, 2024, in conjunction with a sustainability summit. This time additional universities like UT El Paso also presented. It was a resounding success with close to 100 in attendance. TXAPA graciously hosted lunch, dinner, and an evening reception.

During the MASTERS, professors and researchers from Texas institutions presented research on aggregate friction, combining RAP with SAC-A aggregates, fine aggregate's impact on skid resistance, balanced mix design, updates on asphalt binder testing and specification development, and more. The time allowed attendees to meet one another and network, and having an event dedicated to asphalt technology research in Texas allowed for more in-depth presentations and Q&A time.

The goal is for TXAPA to host a MASTERS event each year. The amount of asphalt research being conducted in Texas is nothing short of impressive, and the impact that research has on future asphalt pavement performance affects how we produce our materials. It's my belief the MASTERS at TXAPA will have tremendous value for industry, agencies, and academia, and will drive needed asphalt research. I hope to see you at the next MASTERS in 2025, and together we will tee off our own tradition that will be unlike any other.  $\square$

# TXAPA'S ANNUAL MEETING SHOWCASES PARTNERSHIP, SCHOLARSHIP, AND CONTINUED COMMITMENT TO QUALITY



he TXAPA Annual Meeting this year was truly remarkable, setting records and celebrating the asphalt pavement industry. From the moment it began, the event was fueled by camaraderie and filled with the spirit of partnership that change makes our achievements possible. Regarded as the most highly anticipated industry event of the year, the TXAPA Annual Meeting is the place to network with colleagues, catch up with lifelong friends, and build

new and meaningful connections.

The theme of this year's meeting was "Target Ride to Quality," emphasizing the idea that engineering superior ride quality leads to superior asphalt pavements. Sessions throughout the week were designed to explore this theme from multiple angles. TXAPA's

Jim Warren, Director of Engineering and Technology led an insightful panel discussion on award-winning pavements, Dr. Charles Gurganus (Texas A&M University) presented on improving quality at intersections, and Travis Patton addressed sustainability, outlining a plan for utilizing more recycled asphalt pavement. Discussion centering on heavy-duty pavements, TxDOT's liquid asphalt binder program, and the Asphalt Pavement Quality Initiative emphasized the importance of partnership in achieving shared goals. highlight was the announcement of the APPIP (Asphalt Pavement Performance Improvement Program), which is a result of the industry's ongoing commitment to innovation and quality.

The week kicked off on Monday with the Annual TXAPA Golf Tournament. More

Named in honor of Bob Gallaway, a pioneer in asphalt research and education, the award celebrates those whose dedication reflects his passion for engineering excellence and knowledge sharing.

The 2024 recipient was TxDOT's Chief Engineer, Lance

Simmons. Simmons has been instrumental in driving David Kopp (Ergon Asphalt & Emulsions) and teammate Tommy Smith (TxDOT) and John Lamond

The Texas Asphalt Pavement Hall of Fame, established in 2023, was created to honor individuals whose contributions to the asphalt pavement industry and TXAPA have been both substantial and enduring. These individuals have demonstrated remarkable career achievements, made significant unselfish contributions to the association, and have shown a sustained commitment to advancing asphalt pavement.

As we face new and unprecedented challenges in the industry, it is crucial to acknowledge the leadership of great pioneers has always been a guiding force. The necessity for strong, visionary leaders remains constant, and the Hall of Fame serves as a reminder of the pivotal role these individuals play in shaping the future of asphalt pavement in Texas.

In 2023, the Hall of Fame welcomed its inaugural class, which included Gene Carrier, Chuck Fuller, John Miller, and Murray Ricks. This year, we are proud to induct four more trailblazers: John Deatherage, Charlie Smoot, Gary Corley, and Johnny Weisman. These individuals have laid the groundwork for where we stand today, each playing a vital role in advancing our industry.

### **JOHN DEATHERAGE:** INTEGRITY AND ENDURING COMMITMENT

John Deatherage, an Eagle Scout, Scout Master, and Marine combat veteran, exemplified integrity and leadership throughout his career. Holding an engineering degree from SMU and a master's in asphalt technology from Iowa State, John's dedication extended well beyond his more than 60 years of marriage—his commitment to the asphalt industry was just as enduring.

John began his career at Texas Bitulithic in the 1950s, working his way up to oversee the asphalt division and eventually serving as Vice

President of Fort Worth operations. His service to TXAPA began in the early 1960s and spanned more than four decades. Whenever the industry faced a crisis, John was the person called upon to find solutions.

John served on numerous committees, held two terms on the Board of Directors, was Treasurer in 1975, President in 1977, and became a Life Member in 2003. One of his key achievements was helping the industry adapt to new technologies, including better material handling, electronic controls on pavers, the use of hot mix black base mixtures, and pioneering recycling efforts. His work on emission controls and air quality also paved the way for workable solutions for all stakeholders.

John's leadership shone brightest during a financial crisis at TXAPA in the mid-1970s. As Treasurer in 1975, he reported that the association had only \$648 on hand. However, his proactive approach and strategic planning saved the association from disaster and ensured its future viability.

John's positive, cooperative attitude left an indelible mark on TXAPA, and his legacy continues to inspire. It is with great honor that TXAPA

inducts John Deatherage into the Texas Asphalt Pavement Hall of Fame.

### **CHARLIE SMOOT:** CHAMPION OF QUALITY AND COLLABORATION

Charlie Smoot's journey with TXAPA began in 1974, hired initially to spread the word about quality asphalt pavement. However, just three months later, Charlie found himself stepping

into the role of Executive Director following the unexpected resignation of his predecessor. As a former TxDOT engineer, Charlie wondered what he had gotten himself into, but his transition into association management proved to be a significant turning point for both TXAPA and the asphalt industry in Texas.

Charlie's tireless advocacy for asphalt quality made him a key figure in building relationships with TxDOT, local governments, and the Texas Air Quality Control Board (now the Texas Commission on Environmental Quality or TCEQ). His work with the Air Control Board led to a workable general permit for asphalt plants, which is still in use and remains a foundational milestone in our industry.

As Executive Director from 1974 to 1996, Charlie played a pivotal role in driving numerous industry advancements, including the development of the QC/QA Specification and the establishment of the Hot Mix Asphalt Center for Certification. His leadership also spurred the research and implementation of Full Depth Perpetual Pavement Specifications, the introduction of SMA and Superpave technologies, and the creation of TXAPA's Annual Meeting.

Charlie understood the importance of communication, and his creation of the Hot Mix Asphalt News newsletter—along with his popular "My Nickel" column—helped further the goals of TXAPA. He believed that the dissemination of information was vital to the industry's success, and his commitment to spreading the "gospel of asphalt pavements" was unwavering.

TXAPA is honored to recognize Charlie Smoot's enduring contributions by inducting him into the Texas Asphalt Pavement Hall of Fame.




### JUSTIN WAITS, LEVEL 1B TECHNICIAN OF THE YEAR

### LIQUEFIED NATURAL GAS (LNG) TANK REGULATIONS

iquefied natural gas or LNG is natural gas that has been cooled to liquid form at approximately -265° F. LNG tanks are subject to regulations set forth by the Railroad Commission of Texas (RRC). The extent of these regulations depends on the volume of the tank that is being proposed and the filings required can be found in Section 14.2040 of the RRC's Regulations for Compressed **Natural Gas and Liquefied Natural Gas.** 

Not every plant is going to have the same amenities. For example, many asphalt production plants may not have access to a natural gas pipeline due to their location. Asphalt plants and many industries use machinery and equipment that require high calorific fuels like liquefied natural gas. Additionally, its high density and low volume means that more energy can be stored in less tank space. As a result, LNG tanks are a common sight at asphalt production facilities as well as many other heavy industries.

From a permitting standpoint, commercial LNG tanks can be separated into two categories based upon their volume. If the capacity of the tank is less than 15,540 gallons, the permitting and regulation process is shorter. In fact, there are only two steps required at this volume. These two steps include filling out an LNG Form 2501 which is obtainable from the RRC's website and paying a \$10 fee per tank listed. Additionally, activities involving the LNG tank can commence prior to your submission of Form 2501 if the facility is in compliance with the rules as per Part 3 of Section 14.2040 of the Regulations for Compressed Natural Gas and Liquefied Natural Gas by the RRC.

For tanks over 15,540 gallons, the regulations are more complicated. The required forms, LNG Form 2500 and LNG Form 2500A. must be submitted to the AFS (Alternative Fuels Safety) 30 days before the tank's

installation. A plat drawing from the appraisal district is required that identifies the boundaries of your property and the names of all property owners within a 500-foot radius measured from the location of the proposed tank. Additionally, a site plan is required that shows fire protection, information on other LNG containers on the property, the distance from said containers and dispensers to nearby infrastructure, location and information on other fuel containers and dispensers, and any known hazards or sources of ignition. These filings also must be sent to the property owners within 500 feet of the tank. If your facility LNG tanks will be accessed from a public highway by LNG tank trucks, Texas Department of Transportation needs to verify that the

driveway is of proper design to accommodate such trucks. Once the LNG tank is in place, a written notice of completed construction must be submitted and a field inspection by the RRC must be completed. Once these processes have been approved and completed, the LNG tank can be operated.

In short, the process for obtaining a commercial LNG tank for a site depends on the volume of the tank you're looking to put in. Remember that the threshold is 15,540 gallons so a 15,000-gallon tank can be permitted more easily and in a shorter timeframe than a 16,000-gallon tank.




The event concluded with a lively beach party mixer, where participants had the opportunity to unwind, network, and reflect on the day's experiences.

# **SAFETY IS NO ACCIDENT**

### TxDOT'S FY23 SAFETY REPORT

or TxDOT, safety is all about being present in the moment and maintaining situational awareness. Focus and awareness are essential. Distractions and complacency could lead to incidents & injuries, and when those happen, it's worth asking: *Are you safe, or just lucky?* Relying on luck is a gamble, and as we know, luck eventually runs out. Safety requires a plan—and following through on that plan every time.

## INCIDENT TRENDS: A CLOSER LOOK AT FY23 DATA

TxDOT's fiscal year 2023 safety data reveals both familiar patterns and new challenges. Although the analysis for the most recent fiscal year is still underway, early indications show similar trends. One critical finding is that over half of all recordable vehicle incidents

in FY23 were preventable. Of these, 11% occurred within work zones, highlighting the importance of targeted safety measures in these high-risk areas (see **Fig. 1**).

Employee tenure also plays a significant role in safety outcomes. Nearly one in four preventable vehicle incidents involved employees with less than a year on the job, many of whom

were still wearing "yellow hats," indicating their new-hire status. More concerning is that almost a third of these incidents happened within their first 120 days of being on the job—a period when they are still getting accustomed to safety protocols.

## INJURIES AND LOST TIME: UNCOVERING KEY PATTERNS

TxDOT's injury data highlights the correlation between work zone safety and new employee vulnerability. One in three injuries involved employees with less than one year of tenure, with half of these injuries occurring within the first 90 days. Work zones continue to present a challenge, accounting for nearly 30% of all injuries in FY23. These numbers make it clear that additional safeguards in work zones are necessary to reduce incidents and injuries (see Fig. 2).

Lost production time due to on-the-job injuries is another critical concern. More than a

quarter of reported injuries resulted in lost workdays, with an average of 99 lost production days per injury in construction roles. These lost days represent not only financial costs but also operational setbacks that affect overall project timelines and efficiency.

#### **UNDERSTANDING INJURY CAUSES ACROSS ALL INDUSTRY**

The most common injuries reported were strains and sprains, which made up 38% of all injuries. Overexertion injuries were responsible for 29% of cases, while slips, trips, and falls accounted for 23%. Among injury causes across all industry, slips/falls and overexertion led to most workers' compensation claims, underscoring the need for targeted preventive measures (see Fig. 3).

#### A PATH FORWARD: BUILDING A **CULTURE OF SAFETY**

Addressing these safety challenges requires more than just protocols—it demands a cultural shift that begins with recruitment. TxDOT has started incorporating safety language into job postings and the interview process to emphasize the importance of safety from the outset. New employees now receive enhanced safety orientation, and mentorship programs provide ongoing guidance to help them navigate their first months on the job.

Throughout the year, safety observations are conducted to ensure that employees remain focused and committed to safe practices. To maintain engagement, milestones are celebrated through events like the "Hard Hat Celebration," recognizing individual and team achievements. Training is also ongoing, with seasonal awareness campaigns highlighting safety risks during periods when incidents are most likely to occur.

#### **INNOVATIVE SOLUTIONS:** LEVERAGING TECHNOLOGY

TxDOT is also piloting new technologies to improve safety. In six districts, workers are testing RFID detection systems on equipment such as loaders, skid steers, and rotary brooms. These systems are designed to detect personnel, not just objects, and workers wear passive RFID tags embedded in their hard hats. The goal is to create a safer environment around heavy equipment, reducing the risk of injury.

Work zone safety continues to be a priority, with best practices such as the use of

spotters, staging vehicles according to the 15-50 rule, and avoiding the centerline during operations. Stretch-and-flex routines, performed daily, help reduce strains and sprains, contributing to a safer work environment for all employees.

#### LEADERSHIP AND ACCOUNTABILITY

Building a culture of safety requires buy-in from leadership at all levels. TxDOT emphasizes the importance of leadership through statewide safety committee meetings that bring together district and division leaders, as well as safety officers. Employees look to their leaders for cues, and without visible commitment from the top, safety initiatives lose their impact. At TxDOT, actions speak louder than words—leaders must actively model safety-first behaviors to inspire the same commitment in their teams.

#### CONCLUSION

TxDOT's FY23 data underscores the ongoing need for vigilance, planning, and leadership in fostering a safer work environment. Preventable incidents, injuries among new employees, and lost production time injuries all highlight the areas that require continuous attention. Through mentorship programs, enhanced training, technological innovation, and leadership involvement, TxDOT is striving to move beyond luck and build a culture where safety is the standard. By remaining grounded—focused on the present moment, we can work together to ensure that every plan is executed with precision and every job is completed safely. [
